- 2. Petitions must be signed by at least 25 qualified voters of the school district, and the petition shall state the residence of each signer, as well as the name and residence of the candidate.
- 3. Petition forms will be available at the Customer Service Desk of the library beginning Monday, February 3, 2025.
- 4. Petitions shall be returned to the office of the Library Director no later than 5:00pm on Monday, March 3, 2025.




