Holiday Decoration and Display Policy

The Library functions as an intellectual and cultural resource for the community. Holiday

exhibits and decorations are a means through which the public can share experiences,

appreciate special interests, and celebrate the diversity of the community.

The purpose of this policy is to provide guidelines for holiday displays within the Library

to ensure inclusivity, respect for diversity, and alignment with the Library's mission to

serve all members of the community.

Library staff will create displays that include the various holidays celebrated throughout

the year, as long as the dominant theme or character of the display is secular and the

decorations used have a secular meaning.

It is permissible to create displays showing secular seasonal holiday symbols such as

Christmas trees, menorahs, and Kwanzaa candle holders in the interest of fostering

understanding and respect for the rights of all individuals regarding their beliefs, values,

and customs. Religious symbols or holiday decorations with religious content may not

be displayed.

Such displays are deemed temporary and do not promote a particular religion but

rather, reflect the diversity of beliefs and customs celebrated seasonally through the

year. While input from patrons is always encouraged, the discretion for creating holiday

displays resides solely with the Library and its staff, who shall seek to develop a

balanced representation of different holidays throughout the year.
